TLU HEAD COACH: Dennis Parker, 3rd Season

Dennis Parker is in his third year as head coach for the Texas Lutheran Bulldogs. Parker returned to his Texas coaching roots in 2007 after coaching in Mesa, Ariz., at Mesa High School, for three seasons. Parker led TLU to a two-win improvement in 2008. TLU went 4-6 last season after opening with a 2-8 campaign in 2007, Parker's first year with the program. Parker was hired on Jan. 22, 2007 as the 22nd coach in school history.

Parker was the head coach at North Texas for the 1991, 1992 and 1993 seasons. Parker was also an assistant coach at Southeast Missouri State University from 1977 to 1981. Parker won a state championship at Marshall High School in Marshall, Texas in 1990. Parker took the job at Marshall after serving as the offensive coordinator for Converse Judson on its 1983 state championship team.

LC HEAD COACH: Dennis Dunn, 4th Season

Dennis Dunn enters his fourth year as the head football coach at Louisiana College. In 2008, all of Dunn's hard work and efforts came to fruition as the Wildcats posted the best record (7-3) for the program since its rebirth in 2000.

All of Dunn's clubs have had one of the best offenses in the ASC. In his first season, of their five losses, three came by a combined seven points. In his second season, the Wildcats closed the season with three wins, which had not been done since football was revived at LC in 2000. Then in 2009, Dunn's squad made history, bringing a winning team to the campus for the first time since 1962.

Game Overview

Texas Lutheran plays host to Louisiana College on Saturday in Seguin's Matador Stadium. Saturday's contest is the 2009 TLU Homecoming football game and the final home game for 12 Bulldog seniors: Ben Cooper, John Jackson, Brandon McCoy, Joey Mendoza, James Moore, Jon Randle, Shawn Small, Anthony Smith, Steve Thrash, Frank Vera, James Villarreal, and Eric Walker.

All 12 seniors will be recognized prior to Saturday's kickoff. The Senior Day ceremony will begin at approximately 1:40 p.m.

Seguin radio station KWED 1580 AM will have the game's radio call, starting at 1:30 p.m. KWED's audio can also be found at www.seguintoday.com. The KWED audio is paired with the TLU live video webcast at www.tlu.edu/athletics.

TLU will be out to snap an 11-game losing streak that dates back to the final three games of 2008. The Bulldogs have not tasted victory since Oct. 25, 2008, when TLU won in Abilene with an 18-0 victory over McMurry.

A loss Saturday by TLU would push the new school mark for consecutive losses to 12. The football program has lost 11 games in a row, breaking the record of 10 consecutive losses set on two other occasions in the program's history.

TLU had a 13-game winless streak stretching over the 1954, 1955 and 1956 seasons. The Bulldogs had a tie in the 1955 season that kept the team winless but that stopped the consecutive losses streak at 10.

Louisiana College enters Matador Stadium on a three-game win streak. The Wildcats have wins over East Texas Baptist, Howard Payne and Sul Ross State in the last three contests. On Oct. 24, LC defeated Howard Payne 51-45 in three overtimes in Brownwood, Texas. Last week, the Wildcats' defense pitched a shutout in a 26-0 victory over Sul Ross State.

Texas Lutheran Bulldog greets Richard Miller (football), Lili Torres-Ramirez (women's tennis), Aaron Merhoff (baseball), Craig Saunders (men's basketball) and Madeline Klasing Williams (women's volleyball) will be inducted into the Texas Lutheran Athletics Hall of Fame during halftime of this week's football game as a part of TLU Homecoming ceremonies this weekend.

TLU also will recognize its Athletics Leadership Wall of Honor Class of 2009. This year's inductees are the Honorable Edmund Kuempel and Ken and Linda Voges. Kuempel and the Vogeses will be honored during a pre-game ceremony at the football game.

The TLU Athletics Hall of Fame recognizes former Bulldog student-athletes for their accomplishments in the field of play. The TLU Athletics Leadership Wall of Honor recognizes individuals and groups that have contributed to the success of TLU Athletics outside the field of play.

WHEN TLU HAS THE BALL ...

Texas Lutheran Offense

The Bulldogs are scheduled to start true freshman Rocky Huff (Houston/Jersey Village) for a second consecutive week. Huff is expected to make his third start of the 2009 season. He was the starter in TLU's 22-21 season-opening loss to Trinity and the starter in last week's 38-22 loss to Hardin-Simmons

Against the Cowboys last week, Huff tossed a career-best three touchdowns. He completed 17 of 34 passes for 190 yards, and he had two passes intercepted. His 17 completions, 34 attempts, and 190 yards were all career-high numbers for Huff.

For the season, Huff is completing 46.8 percent of his passes. He has five TD passes and five interceptions to go with 364 yards passing.

TLU quarterbacks on the season have thrown a conference-high 22 interceptions and 14 touchdowns. The team completion percentage is only 45.0.

TLU moved up to eighth in the conference (from ninth) in the American Southwest Conference for scoring average (17.8). TLU remains last in the American Southwest Conference in total offense (247.1 yards per game), interceptions thrown (22), third-down conversions (30.0 percent), and turnover margin (-2.62 per game).

Senior running back Anthony Smith (Bay City/Bay City/Blinn JC) is TLU's leading rusher (251 yards) and third-leading receiver (204 yards). Smith is third in the ASC in all-purpose yardage at 143.2 per game. In addition to his rushing and receiving numbers, Smith has 663 kickoff return yards (most in the ASC) and 28 yards on punt returns.

Steven Thrash (Hubbard/Hubbard) is the top receiving threat for the Bulldogs. Thrash is fourth in the league in receiving yards per game (71.9). He has 44 catches for 575 yards with six touchdowns. Last week against Hardin-Simmons, Thrash had a team-best eight catches and produced 67 receiving yards. He had a seven-yard TD grab. Thrash leads the team in scoring with 36 points. His six touchdowns this season is a career-best for single-season TDs. Thrash had five last season and now has 11 career TDs (all receiving).

Senior receiver Jonathon Randle put up another career day last week. After posting the first 100-yard performance of his career (two weeks ago against McMurry), Randle had seven grabs for 109 yards against Hardin-Simmons last Saturday. Randle caught a 49-yard TD pass from Huff in the road loss. For his career, Randle has six TD catches (including four this season).

Place-kicker Allen Cain, a true freshman from San Antonio (Stevens), connected on a career-best 40-yard field goal last week against HSU. But Cain's streak of perfect PATs came to an end at 12. Cain's first PAT of last Saturday was blocked. He is now 13-for-14 on the season. Cain is second on the team in scoring, with 22 points.

Louisiana College Defense

The Louisiana College defense comes off a 26-0 shutout against Sul Ross State last weekend. The Wildcats held Sul Ross to five first downs, 85 net rushing yards and 32 net passing yards for a grand total offense number of 117 yards. The Wildcats held the Lobos to 2.5 yards per attempt and to 2.3 yards per play.

Senior linebacker Donovan Williams had a team-best six tackles last week and a tackle for loss. Taylor Cottano, LC's middle linebacker, had the lone team sack. Senior right defensive end Ty Webb collected four tackles with a team-high 2.5 tackles for loss.

For the season, senior free safety Lance Stone is the team's leading tackler, with 56. He has two interceptions, four pass break-ups, six passes defend, and a fumble recovery. Second on the team in tackles is Cottano, with 52.

Senior nose guard James Fowler has a team-best eight tackles for loss (for 23 yards in losses) and a team-high 2.5 sacks (for 12 yards).

Freshman cornerback Reggie Calhoun and junior safety Kendrick Thomas are tied for the team lead in interceptions, with three each. Calhoun has 55 yards in INT returns. Calhoun leads LC in passes defended (13), pass break-ups (10) and forced fumbles (2).

As a defensive unit, LC ranks fifth in the ASC in scoring defense (30.4), fifth in total defense (379.9), third in rushing defense (147.5), and seventh in passing defense (232.4). The Wildcats are second in the ASC in interceptions, with 12. LC is third-to-last in the conference in total sacks, with 12. The Wildcats hold opponents to a 37.4 percent conversion rate on third down.

WHEN LC HAS THE BALL ...

Louisiana College Offense

The 6-foot-2 and 200-pound junior quarterback Ben McLaughlin leads the Louisiana College offense. McLaughlin has passed for 2,267 yards with 19 TDs and seven interceptions.

McLaughlin has at his disposal one of the most dangerous offensive players in the conference with junior Jordan Rideaux, who leads the ASC in receptions per game (7.6), receiving yards per game (116.5), and all-purpose yardage per game (198.2). Rideaux is third in the NCAA Division III for all-purpose yardage per game. He has 275 punt return yards and 371 kick return yards to go with his 932 yards receiving and eight rushing yards.

Rideaux has scored 10 total touchdowns in 2009. Eight TDs have come via receptions, and two TDs have come in the return game (one on a punt return and one a kick return). He took back a punt return 70 yards last week against Sul Ross State. He had a 97-yard TD kickoff return in a 54-44 loss to Mississippi College on Oct. 3.

LC running back Chad Hindman is 10th in the conference in rushing. He has 379 yards on 77 carries (an average of 4.9 yards per carry). He has four TDs rushing with a long of 48.

LC is third in the league in scoring offense (36.4), second in total offense (427.5), sixth in rushing offense (126.1), and third in passing offense (301.4). LC leads the conference in punt return average (20.3) and in kickoff return TDs (2). The Wildcats are second in first downs gained and third in third-down conversions (41.7 percent).

Texas Lutheran Defense

The Bulldogs remain last in the conference in scoring defense, at 40.0 points per game. TLU is seventh in total defense (400.8 yards per game), giving up exactly the same average yards per game in passing and in rushing (200.4 per game).

Although the team is fourth in passing yards allowed per game, TLU has surrendered 19 TD passes (tied for second-most in the league) and intercepted only four passes (fewest in the league). Plus, opposing quarterbacks are completing a conference-high 64.8 percent of their passes against the Bulldog defense.

The big positive on defense for TLU in 2009 has been the play of freshman defensive end Chris Kyle (McAllen/McAllen). Kyle leads the ASC in sacks, with nine.

Kyle also ranks in the NCAA Division III Top 10 for sacks. He currently ranks 7th in NCAA DIII at 1.13 sacks per game.

Kyle also leads the conference in tackles for loss, with 13.5 for 86 yards in losses. He averages 1.69 tackles for loss per game. In the NCAA DIII rankings, Kyle is 27th in the nation.

TLU senior cornerback Brandon McCoy (San Antonio/Jay) enjoyed a good day last week against Hardin-Simmons. McCoy intercepted a pass and returned in 36 yards. He also forced a fumble that was recovered by the Bulldogs.

Frank Vera handles the punting for TLU. The senior from Laredo is fourth in the ASC in punting average, at 38.4. Vera has a long of 60, 10 fair catches forced, and 11 punts inside the opponent's 20. Last week against Hardin-Simmons, Vera booted his 60-yarder and put two punts inside the HSU 20.

ABILENE, Texas - Texas Lutheran freshman quarterback Rocky Huff tossed a career-best three touchdowns, but the performance was not enough to prevent the Bulldogs from dropping to 0-8 after a 38-22 loss to Hardin-Simmons.

At HSU's Shelton Stadium, Hardin-Simmons running back Steven Rockwell scored on runs of 14 and six yards and finished with 133 yards rushing on 14 carries.

HSU moved to 5-4 overall and to 4-3 in the American Southwest Conference with the victory. HSU is 11-1 all-time against TLU. The Cowboys have never lost a home game against the Bulldogs.

TLU fell to 0-6 in the American Southwest Conference. The Bulldogs have dropped nine consecutive games in conference play.

In Saturday's contest in Abilene, the Bulldogs fell behind 24-3 but scored 13 points in the third quarter to stay within two touchdowns of the Cowboys. Billy Hardee caught a 7-yard TD pass from Huff at the 10:16 mark of the third, and Jonathon Randle grabbed a 49-yard pass (again from Huff) at the 5:14 mark of the quarter. Randle, a senior, went over 100 yards for the second straight game. He had seven receptions for 109 yards.

Steven Thrash concluded the Bulldogs' scoring with a 7-yard TD reception from Huff. The catch capped a 13-play, 70-yard drive that took 6:24 off the clock in the fourth quarter. Thrash's score brought TLU within 16, at 38-22. The two-point pass attempt by Huff failed.

TLU's Huff, in his second career start, was 17-for-34 for 190 yards and two interceptions.

LAST WEEK FOR LOUISIANA COLLEGE Louisiana College 26, Sul Ross State 0

PINEVILLE – The Wildcat defense had its best outing in recent memory, and Louisiana College's offense was Louisiana College's offense as the Wildcats shut out American Southwest Conference foe Sul Ross 26-0.

The LC defense, which had been allowing an average of more than 40 points a game, showed up big, allowing the Lobos (who fell to 2-6 overall and 2-4 in ASC play) to 117 yards of total offense, 85 on the ground and 32 through the air.

Conversely, the LC offense was good for 482 yards of total offense, 332 through the air and 117 on the ground.

And the star of the show, both on offense and special teams, was junior wide receiver/return man Jordan Rideaux, who caught eight passes for 172 yards and a score and returned four punts for 100 yards including a 70-yard touchdown scamper.

Add in his 25-yard return on Sul Ross' lone kickoff of the day and the Carencro native finished the day with 297 yards of total offense.

While Rideaux was the star, it was kicker John Michiels who started the scoring for the Wildcats, connecting on a 21-yard field goal early in the game to give LC a 3-0 lead.

Before the half Rideaux hauled in a 31-yard touchdown pass from Ben McLaughlin to extend the Wildcats' lead to 10-0.

McLaughlin finished the day with 290 yards on 17-for-36 passing with a touchdown and one interception. Ironically, McLaughlin's lone pick resulted in points for the Wildcats as, two plays following the change of possession at the Sul Ross three, the Wildcats defense, led by Donovan Williams, forced a safety.

Last Meeting between Texas Lutheran and Louisiana College Louisiana College 29, Texas Lutheran 7 (Nov. 8, 2008 in Pineville, La.)

PINEVILLE, La. – Louisiana College broke open a close game with 14 points in the fourth quarter to score a 29-7 American Southwest Conference victory over visiting Texas Lutheran.

With the victory at Wildcat Field, Louisiana College improved to 6-3 overall and to 4-3 in the ASC.

TLU dropped its second consecutive game and fell to 4-5 overall and to 3-4 in the ASC.

LC led 15-0 at halftime after Derek Lewis touchdown passes to Jarell Price and Zach Morris and a 33-yard field goal from John Michiels.

TLU closed the gap to 15-7 with a Roderick Batson (Houston/Mayde Creek) touchdown run at the 5:01 mark of the third quarter. Batson scored on a three-yard run to cap a drive that covered 30 yards.

The 30-yard scoring drive was set-up by a Frank Vera (Laredo/Nixon) punt that pinned LC at its own 3-yard line. LC went three-and-out on its offensive possession and punted to the LC 40, where the Bulldogs engineered a 10-yard return.
